Description of the "Other Related Service"

INDEPENDENT STUDY: Independent Study Services is provided to special education students as determined by each individual student's IEP. Services are provided once a week. Related Services are provided as determined by each student's IEP and may be provided in a variety of settings including district sites, the home and in the community. Core curriculum instruction in all subjects required for earning a high school diploma is provided. Specially designed curriculum is provided to special education students whose IEP and identified needs indicate they would benefit from a functional curriculum. Special education students receiving Independent Study have access to the program libraries and computer facilities as needed. Parent/Guardians are encouraged to participate and ensure students complete all assignments.

Description of the "Other Related Service"

IN HOME OR HOSPITAL PROGRAM: Provides primary or related services during visits in the home, hospital, or in a mutually agreed upon location, up to five hours per week in accordance with needs identified in each student's IEP. Support for the modification of the core curriculum and/or functional life skills curriculum is provided as determined by the IEP. Since primary care givers must oversee all instruction, their participation in the IEP is critical. When needed, the Home/Hospital instructor and/or related service providers staff assists the caregiver in utilizing community resources.
